This rubric addresses many aspects of gifted education: assessment; differentiated curriculum development and authenticity; teacher efficacy and teaching evaluation; academic awareness and readiness; and advocacy.

In this presentation, Dr. Kaplan will lead participants through the document and its many uses as well as guide them in its application. Attendees are encouraged to bring a sample lesson AND STUDENT WORK from that lesson for hands-on application. The document will help you identify levels of work from NOVICE to CONVERSANT to EXPERT/PROFICIENT.

Dr. Kaplan is a Clinical Professor at the University of Southern California and in great demand as a speaker around the nation and the world regarding her innovative practices for improving curriculum for gifted learners. She's the past president of both the California Association for the Gifted and the National Association for Gifted Children.
